Passengers arriving from the above countries are not required to be self-insulated for 14 days from the date of arrival to the Republic of Belarus.

It is recommended for foreigners arriving to the Republic of Belarus have a negative PCR- testing at the state border of the Republic of Belarus.

PCR must be performed no later than two days before the date of border crossing.
